About the Bethel Regional ABE Program By Kathy Hanson

The long-standing Bethel Regional Adult Basic Education (ABE) Program is up and running at Yuut Elitnaurviat. Books, faculty, students and our well known plant jungle made the move to the new facility in the fall of 2009. Happily, it didn't take long for people to find us, and already this year students have put in hundreds of hours studying and testing.

We offer an accredited high school diploma by examination through the General Educational Development (GED) Testing Service. The GED tests include: Writing, Reading, Social Studies, Science and Mathematics. GED preparation and instruction are available Monday- Friday from September to May. Classes are offered in reading, writing and math. Tutoring is provided in all subjects. The Bethel Regional ABE Program is an Official GED Testing Center. Thirty-nine students have graduated so far this school year.

Our first graduation ceremony will be held on May 5th at Yuut Elitnaurviat and all are welcome to attend.

The ABE program has served the YK Delta for 37 years and we look forward to many more.

In addition to the GED Program, we offer:

- 1) Basic Academic Skill Building in Math,
 Reading, and Writing for the purpose of
 earning a GED, getting or keeping a job or
 entering college or training; and,
- 2) Assessment testing, using the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE).

All ABE services are free!

Six years later, now 24-year-old Martin has completed the required 8000 on-the-job (OJT) hours and related training instruction. All he needs to do to be a journeyman is to pass the state licensing exam.

Everywhere Jason goes people are impressed and comment on how focused he is. After graduating from Mt. Edgecumbe in 2003, Jason completed the Alaska Job Corps Electrical A Level Program. He said early on he thought of other careers, but electrical came along and his goal was to become a journeyman electrician from the beginning. After completing Job Corps, Jason interviewed and was ranked #1 for an electrical apprenticeship with the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta Apprenticeship Program. He first worked for Elec-T-Serve, but finished his apprenticeship hours with YKHC Construction.

Jason's advice for others is, "you have to keep your mind set to your goals." His new goal now is to pass his test. He will be taking the state exam as soon as a date is set. His dreams now are to have a good family and support them. His hobbies include subsistence hunting and fishing and playing and watching sports. All of Jason's hard work and dedication to becoming a journeyman is paying off.

YK Delta Career Guide By Jackie Johnson

Yuut Elitnaurviat became grantee of Youth First grant funds supporting the YK Delta Career Guide program as of Summer 2009. Jackie Johnson, Yuut Elitnaurviat Program Coordinator accepted this position Fall 2009 and has since implemented services to in-school and out-of-school youth, community members and agencies in Bethel and surrounding villages. This position moved from the YK Delta Job Center where it had been in place since 2005.

Since December 2009, Jackie has provided services to 232 youth, community members, school and agency staff in Bethel and the villages of Aniak, Kalskag, Crooked Creek, Sleetmute, Chuathbulak, Stony River, Alakanuk, Scammon Bay and Russian Mission. A visit to Emmonak will take place this month.

Services are free and individuals can make an appointment to meet with Jackie. Some services provided include assistance in registering and using the Alaska Labor Exchange System, (ALEXsys), Alaska Career Information System (AKCIS), interest, skills, and values assessments, job search, financial aid information, and locating appropriate training programs.

At least once a month there is a Permit Class where students become familiar with the DMV Manual, have questions answered and prepare for the written Permit Test.

Once you have your Permit then you are ready to take the Driving Academy, eight hours of important, informative, and fun activities concerning driving on today's highways. The Driving Academy is usually offered in two four hour sessions on consecutive days, also at least once a month. You will be given a "Certificate of Completion", that if your insurance accepts, you may receive a discount on your insurance.

Now you are ready to get Behind the Wheel with one on one driving instructions with our instructor. There is up to eight hours of driving instruction basics with you doing the driving and we provide the vehicle.

You will be prepared to take and pass your Road Test by the conclusion of the course.

Jaylene Fitka and Kimberly Charlie are sisters, along with these two sisters is, cousin Thomas Fitka attend training at Yuut Elitnaurviat. Theses three are working under the Marshall Stimulus project for House Construction.

All three participants have attended the January Construction Basics, February Oil Fired Burner, February Plumbing Orientation, and also March Electrical Academies.

Thomas heard about our program from his foreman at the Marshall Tribal Council, and wanted to use this knowledge to get where he wants to continue working and becoming a journeyman electrician or plumber through trainings at YE.

When asked what they liked about YE programs, "Convenient, close to home, cost efficient, get experience in a trade and the instructors are beneficial." Jaylene states as she laughs. Back home in Marshall, she said she wasn't going anywhere, and this training has helped open up more options for her.

Kimberly was working as a part-time Lead Housekeeper, but in order for her to finish her trainings; she gave up her part-time job to attend trainings.

After Kimberly completes her trainings, she wants to open a business with her sister Jaylene; they want to call it J&K Construction.

They would like to further their trainings by taking the Electrical Academy in March, Advanced Carpentry and Finish/Trim out Academies in May, and Plumbing Level 1 in June. Which is about 8 additional weeks of dedicated class time and hands on training.

Interested in learning a trade? Yuut Elitnaurviat offers trainings for Construction Basics, which is 3 (three) weeks long with a \$75 course fee, we also have Electrical,

Plumbing, Advanced Carpentry, Boiler Maintenance, and Oil Fired Burner trainings are each 2 (two) weeks long with a \$50 course fee, additionally YE offers Finish/Trim Out, HAZWOP, and HAZMAT trainings which are 1 (one) week long with a \$25 course fee.


So far this year, YE has offered 3 Construction Basics Academies each three weeks long, 1 Oil Fired Burner Academy two weeks, 1 Plumbing Academy two weeks, and 1 Electrical Academy two weeks long.

All together, YE has served 68 people with classroom instruction and hands-on-learning.
